## Standard operating procedure (SoP) for implementation of High Density Plantation Programme-DBT Mode.

1. Director Horticulture J/K shall allot the targets to all the CHOs in the month of February each year on the basis of :-

(a) Budget Estimate figures received from the Finance Department.

(b) Availability of quarantined planting material with the PEs which shall be verified and finalized by the committee constituted for the purpose by the Government (The variety wise availability of quarantined planting material to be utilized against the Budget released for the purpose shall be monitored regularly and concerned committee shall submit the report to the Administrative department quarterly).

(c) Targets already defined in the Revisited modified high density plantation Scheme notified vide GO No. 425-JK(APD) of 2022 dt 27.12.22 as given below.

2. The targets to the Districts shall be allotted on the basis of area under Horticulture crops/number of Horticulture zones in the District besides the demand and potential in the Districts. The Director of Horticulture can shift targets from one district to another for any valid and justified reasons to be submitted by concerned CHO. In such case these targets shall be allocated to the districts with more demand.
3. The Chief Horticulture Officers (CHOs) shall further allot the targets to the Horticulture Development Officers/zones within ten (10) days from the date of receipt of targets from the Directorate for calling the applications from the farmers/orchardists in online mode and shall also ensure wide publicity in the District.
4. The farmer shall submit their application on the prescribed format only through online mode (Jansugam.jk.gov.in) with all the relevant documents like: Revenue Extracts (Jamabandi, Girdawari, Naksh-e-intekhab), alongwith Geo-tagged pictures, Mobile number, Aadhar card, Bank Account details etc. Disposal must be strictly on First come First serve basis.
5. The farmer shall necessarily mention the choice of the Private Enterprise (PE) in the Application Form through whom he intends to get his orchard developed.
6. In case the farmer opts for PE who does not have sufficient no. of plants available or has already completed his assigned targets, CHO shall ensure that such farmer can opt for another PE who shall have the plants and targets available.
